Conclave Deadwood 2019 By: Laurie Wilford

Many people are surprised that we drive such long distances in our Healeys. I understand when you have an old car that there is a concern about breaking down on the side of the road. I can tell you that our cars, and your Healey, are perfectly reliable as long as they are maintained! Plus they are easy for us to do repairs ourselves if need be. Old tires, poor brakes and lack of tune ups and maintenance will cause problems even in modern cars.

At the end of August eleven Healey couples from the Southern Ontario club left for an 18 day, 6800 kilometer drive from Southern Ontario to Deadwood, SD. Eight cars; the Bridgemans, Chapples, Dousts, Lenard Thomases, Salters, Turls, and Wilfords met the Rick Thomases in

Sault Ste Marie on August 31 for a more northern route. Three other cars (the Yules, Hurdles, and Bruce/ White) decided to take the last Steam powered ferry across Lake Michigan and stay south. Since Diane and I were part of the Northern group we will tell our tale. Because we had so many cars, we planned a fairly firm route and made motels reservations for the whole trip in advance. From experience we planned short drives of 400 to 500 kilometers each of the ten travelling days. While the cars can go a lot further, this is supposed to be a vacation and half the adventure is in the journey. I use a program called Microsoft Streets and Trips for planning. Even small towns usually have good friendly restaurants and worthwhile points of interest.











Roger and Lise Hamel from Montreal surprised us in the parking lot as we prepared to leave Sault Ste Marie, and drove with us to Conclave. Bob and the Southern group met up with Gareth and Mike Sudul from Rothesay, NB, the eventual long distance award winners. We also met up with Glen and Donna Paterson from Thunder Bay in St. Cloud, MN. All three of these cars became honorary Southern Ontario members for the duration.

With nights in Hurley, WS, St. Paul, MN, and Aberdeen, SD before our destination in Deadwood we saw lots of beautiful country and the cars love to be exercised. We had mainly top down driving on the trip there with time to stop for local attractions and photo opportunities (As Facebook friends of Pauline Thomas or Austin Healey Club of Southern

Ontario can attest). The US South Superior route through Duluth is not as scenic as the Canadian North Superior one we took home, but side trips to see the Apostle Islands and local attractions and museums added to the drive. The drive through Minnesota and much of South Dakota was hot and flat with fields of corn and sunflowers. Healey air conditioning (top up, side and rear windows down) cooled us right down.

We arrived two days before Conclave to take advantage of the local scenery and drives. It was spectacular. We spent the first day driving to Wall and the Badlands. While shopping at Wall was not my favourite pastime, The Badlands on day one and the second day driving to Spearfish and Devils Tower were among the most scenic drives I have ever had in a Healey.

Conclave was fantastic! With over 250 registrations the Minnesota group had to make a lot of changes along the way. We were spread out at five different hotels, but the host hotel, Deadwood Grand, was only a five minute walk to the other two main hotels. Unfortunately Mal and Erica and Glenn and Donna were a drive away from the group. The rest of Conclave was well organized. And did I tell you about the wonderful drives around Deadwood, Sturgis, and Rapid City. The Rally took us to Custer, Rushmore, and Crazy Horse. There was also an evening bus tour to Mount Rushmore. It was clear in the early evening but clouds blocked the light show at night. There were self guided tours on Tuesday and we toured the Black Hills and Needles Highway. If you get the opportunity you have to experience these drives. Preferably top down in a Healey!






