A Different Breed, But Still British

While on our recent trip to England, Tom and I decided to take advantage of the fact that we were staying in Malvern—home of the Morgan Motor Company for the past 110 years—and have a tour of the factory. Fortunately, our timing was spot on as ours was one of the last tours to take place for the next 15 weeks as they re-model a couple of the buildings!

And while Healey fever runs deep in our family, all I can say is WOW! A Morgan might just be something to consider after seeing these cars so up close and in depth.

The Morgan Motor Company began in 1909 with the iconic Morgan 3-wheeler. The 4-4 followed in 1936 and is still produced today—the longest running production car in the world!

Now with the 4th generation at the helm, the Morgan family has joined with an investment company to help expand their research and development of the brand.

As seen on the tour, each one of these cars is hand crafted and the detail that goes into the build is beyond compare.

Upon arrival at the factory, you

would be hard pressed to know what actually goes on there. The factory is housed in several buildings all in rows with neighbourhoods all around! The only give-away were the beautiful 3-wheelers parked outside and the fellows cleaning the Plus 4 that was being prepped for a 'day hire'. You too can partake in a Morgan driving experience. Only £235 for 7 hours (roughly \$415).

The tour begins in the assembly area where they are fitting the wiring, axles, engines, etc. They have a production line of sorts, but nothing is automated. It is all done by moving the rolling chassis around the buildings by hand through each stage of assembly. There were roughly 6 cars in various stages in this part of the tour.

From there we saw where the metal is formed into the bonnets, fenders, etc. Again, all by hand and fitted to each individual car. There were about another half dozen cars in this stage and not all the same model. They build 4 different models in these parts of the factory.

Oddly, next came the building

where the Ash wood framing pieces are made, which is one of the first steps in the build. These pieces are still made the same way they were in the beginning. A lot of glue and time!

After assembly, the car is dismantled for painting. It goes through an intense inspection and then is re-assembled and taken to the trim shop. This is where all the bling and soft items are added in.


From this point, we were taken over to the 3-wheeler division and had a glimpse of another 6 or so cars going through the assembly stages there.

There were Morgans all over the property, parked outside, being driven between buildings and on display. It was truly an enjoyable tour and something we would recommend if you find yourself in the area. Of course we had a late lunch at The Morgan Pub afterwards. I don't believe they're associated with the factory, but the food was excellent!


