


Editor's Note:

From Geoff:

The highlight of my visit were the stories from Hans. From how he started the museum and why (to evade Netherlands heavy capital gains tax) to the unique histories of many of the cars – particularly his green one – which is a relatively new acquisition.

I was lucky to get in to the museum. It is typically only open to the public on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. I emailed ahead and they just happened to be cleaning up on Monday from their monthly local club meeting. When I arrived Hans made a special trip over – which was nice—and gave me a fantastic tour and history lesson.

Things I saw there:

- 1. The prototype Healey that was 6" wide, longer and had a RR engine and automatic transmission. These were to directly compete with XKE's and, if I recall correctly, BMC decided this new Healey would take too much of a bite out of Jaguar sales and that was the end of the Healeys. (side note: Han's did not relate this story to me but his local assistant did)
- 2. Beautiful Silverstone. (I think the newer Allard's copied a lot of the stylings off this car!?)
- 3. Han's personal 100 that is painted a Rover green and has a fully balanced and blueprinted engine
- 4. Donald Healy's personal car that includes a lot of experimental design idea's.
- 5. A Healey that was totally redone by Rudd.
- 6. The little blue Bug Eyed Sprite with a turbocharged engine.
