

Is Your Choke Working Properly? Written By: Peter LoRe

This past summer, while rebuilding the HD8 carbs on the Healey, I discovered that the round friction discs on both cam shoes, part of the 'fast idle push rod', had disintegrated. This would prevent the chokes from operating smoothly and effectively.

A bit of explanation may be helpful.

When you pull the CHOKE knob inside the car, you initiate a series of mechanical movements, one of which rotates a brass cam (see Photo 3).

This presses down on the cam shoe's friction disc and lowers the fast idle push rod (photo 4). Doing so initiates the 'fast idle', the first step of applying the choke, by slightly opening the throttle plate. If the friction disc(s) are damaged or non-existent, the choke knob will be difficult to pull and the 'fast idle push rods' will not engage fully or properly.

The contact point at which the brass cam strikes the cam shoe must be even and smooth. New cam shoes are available from Burlen Ltd. (UK) or from several other sources online including eBay, for about \$100 US, part number AUC8962.

To remedy my problem, I decide to find a replacement for the friction discs. I found that Paulin No.6 flat nylon washers fit perfectly and cost 15¢ each at Home Depot. I hammered out the retaining pin and installed 4 new washers per shoe. Once installed, I re-secured the retaining pin by peening the end. The solution was cheap and successful.




For a club of our size, the site has seen a fair bit of Internet traffic. For 2019, please see our statistics from Canadian Web Hosting in the table here:

I came across several British car websites that offer a few activities to keep you busy.



It is easier to color your Austin-Healey before you cut it out. Felt tip markers or color pencils work great







