The Rockton British Car Show & Flea Market 9:00 am-1:30 pm

That's right, we are full steam ahead for our big event. Just 10 days from now. So let me fill you in with some important details.

The location is the Rockton Fairgrounds, 812, Old Hwy 8, Rockton, Ontario.

Public and volunteer parking (free) will be in the grassed lot across the road from the main entrance.

British cars will enter through the main gate and park in the <u>Car Show</u> area.

BRING YOUR BRITISH CAR!

All visitors (18 and over) will pay at the gatehouse near the entrance gate. Admission is \$7.00 each. (It helps a lot if you bring the correct change!)

At the gate you will be required to reply to some Covid Self Screening questions, (no symptoms, no out of country in last 14 days).

Everyone who enters must have their hand stamped.

To enter the flea market building you MUST show proof of Full Vaccination and photo ID. Upon showing proof, you will get another hand stamp which will allow you to exit and re-enter without showing proof again. If you cannot show proof, you will not be permitted to enter the building. These are provincial requirements.

Masks are required inside the building.
They are recommending masks outside on the fairgrounds.
2 M distancing is also recommended.

OK, that's it, come out to Rockton on the 17th for a great British Car Event.

And, once again I have organized warm and sunny weather.



AHCSO Fall Election Tour 2021 By: Laurie Wilford

This tour actually began for most of the group a year ago. Rhode Island is one of the few US states that Diane and I have not visited in a Healey, so we were looking forward to joining other Southern Ontario Healey couples there for Summit in September 2020. The COVID pandemic cancelled Summit 2020 and a number of AHSCO members decided to have the New England chapter hold our registrations until this year.

Since the US border remains closed, Summit 2021was held without the Southern Ontario cars. Mark and Heather Doust with Rick and Pauline Thomas decided to arrange an Election tour of Summit registrants, and interested AHCSO members, to Ottawa and Western Quebec. Heather looked after the route and excursions while Pauline arranged the meals. Since we were starting from such different locations, nine Healey couples agreed to meet at the Sword Motor Inn, Bancroft Ontario on September 19th to begin our adventure. With the election scheduled for September 20th, we all had to vote early.

The sunny but chilly Sunday morning Diane and I left top down along secondary highways to meet the Hurdles and Yules at Mono Mills by 11:30. While jackets were needed to start, it was shirtsleeves by 11:30. We drove up Airport road to County Road 21 and enjoyed the scenic drive through Camp Borden to meet the Dousts at a Tim Hortons near the 400 in Barrie. After a quick lunch, we drove through Orillia and met the Chapples just outside Rama and the Bridgemans on the road around ten minutes later. The Thomases who had driven from Sault Ste Marie and the Salters from Dwight were waiting for us as we stopped for a break outside Cardiff. After 345 kilometres we met up with the rest of the group at the Inn. What a treat to be back to some semblance of normal with a bunch of our Healey

friends! Dinner that night at the Bancroft Brewery with double vaccinated COVID protocols and only four people per table brought us back to reality!

Monday was sunny again and during the easy backroad drive to Ottawa we stopped and climbed the Manitou Mountain Train near Calabogie. This was a steep, rocky climb to the Eagles nest for a great view. We then discovered the easy road down!

Driving was great until we had to get on the 417. Busy multi lane freeways are not the best Healey driving, trying to keep 10 cars together is impossible in traffic. While the Newtons and us arrived at the Novotel quickly, it was more of a challenge for others. Our location just off Rideau Street and near the Byward market and Parliament Hill was great. We settled into the hotel and then walked to The Aulde Dubliner for dinner. After two top -down days of driving, it was an early night for most of the group. This was compounded by the hotel COVID requirement that groups in the lobby social distance and that no food or beverages were to be consumed in the lobby. That meant we did not get together for breakfasts or socializing as much as other trips. It will be great when we are all vaccinated and this is behind us!





Day three was again bright and sunny for our first excursion. We had a topdown scenic drive along the Quebec side of the Ottawa River to meet Quebec Austin Healey owners Roger and Lise Hamel in Montebello for lunch. After lunch we were lead on a scenic drive by the Hamels to Lac McGregor and Wakefield before returning to the hotel. As we returned home the skies darkened as a portent of things to come the next three days! Some of our group walked the four kilometers to dinner at Canal Ritz while others drove. It was great that Michel Beauregard, the President of the Quebec Healey club, drove from Montreal to meet us for dinner that night.

Fortunately, the next day started with overcast and a light mist that progressed only to light rain. That gave us time for breakfast or brunch in small groups at the Byward Market and most had a chance to sightsee around Parliament Hill. Unfortunately, Parliament is in the middle of extensive renovations and between added security, COVID concerns and renovation closures, we could not get as close to a number of places as we would have liked. That being said it was a pleasant way to spend a morning. Most of the group had decided to go to either the War Museum or Science Museum in the afternoon. Heather had arranged tickets for 1:00 and by the time we were ready to leave it was raining quite heavily. As a result, we decided to get a ten-minute Uber ride. After an interesting afternoon at the Museums. we prepared for dinner at The Brig Restaurant. It has very good food and the walk there and back added to the Ottawa ambience. Altogether we had a very satisfying last day in Ottawa.

The next morning, we had a now normal quick takeout breakfast in our room from Tim Hortons and planned to leave around 9:00. There was a light rain in the morning so all the cars were top up for the drive home. The Salters and Hamels were on the way to Montreal, while the rest were heading towards home. That meant one more





day on the road for most of us. Newtons were stopping in Minden for two nights at the Dominion Hotel run by Healey owners Shawn and Ellie Chamberlain. The Thomases were again staying at the Salters' Bunkie in Dwight, and the Bridgemans, Chapples, Wilford and Yules were staying at the Bridgeman cottage in Bala. We arranged to drive secondary roads most of the way home and to meet for gas outside Shawville. From there we crossed to Ontario and crossed through Algonquin Park on the way to Bala. On the East side of Algonquin, we all stopped for a memorable lunch at Wilno Tavern. The rain remained mostly light all that day. The Bridgeman group walked to dinner in Bala, having to change location since the original pub only allowed dining outside and, by the time we ate around 8:00, it was a bit chilly for that. Fortunately, John found a nice restaurant in Bala that could take our group at the last minute.

The Chapples, Wilfords, and Yules departed Bala after John and Wendy served us a great breakfast Thursday morning. It was a top-down drive, again without much heavy rain. The Chapples split off in Barrie, the Yules at Hwy 89 and Airport road. We put 1475 kilometers on the Healey, and as with most trips, there were no mechanical issues with any of the cars. 
