




### AHCA Delegates Report

Because of the continuation of Covid, the meeting held in Indianapolis, was both in person and on Zoom.

There were approximately an equal number of Delegates for each.

After the welcome by president Gary Feldman, the roll call was taken and the minutes of the previous year's meeting were approved.

The area Club reports had been previously submitted, so in the interest of time they were not read.

#### Leadership reports were next and were as follows:

- \*The insurance rules for speed events have changed and helmets now have to be inspected and have manufacturers tags stating age etc. Full details of the changes will be on the new website. The liability premium has increased by \$1000 and Gymkahnas etc now have an event premium of \$225.
- \*The AHCA website is now running under Club Express, Local clubs can do the same and there will be templates available.
- \*Membership stands at 2814 down from 2943. (When I started as delegate in 2006 it was 3605.)
- \*There are no new items of regalia and nothing will be done until the new website is fully functional. Then grill badges will be the first item produced.
- \*The advertising rates are due to rise and some concern was expressed by delegates who are also advertisers.
- \*Healey Marque came in at 2.2% under budget. It cost \$110371.92 to publish. Member pictures submitted for the calendar are sold out beyond 2023. The money raised (\$250 per month) is donated to the DMH fund which now stands at \$34519.00. Two \$3000 scholarships were awarded to students attending McPherson College in Kansas for auto restoration.
- \*The Quebec Club offers a seat by auction for the drivers parade that they organize at the Canadian Grand Prix. The seat for 2022 sold for \$4100. \$2800 of that goes to the DMH fund and \$1300 to the Quebec club.
- \*Conclave 2021 in Big Bear organized by the S. California club had 155 registrations. Their silent auction raised \$10,000 and they made a profit of \$3034 after repaying the AHCA seed money loan.
- \*Enclave from Sept18-22nd in the Poconos has 70 registrations so far and is expecting 160 but hoping for 200+
- \*There is no site for Conclave 2023 as yet. It was agreed that a committee would be formed by National to come up with a location and have clubs in that area help to organize an event. Branson Mo is being looked at. A future sit being considered is Santa Fe NM.
  - \*The Future 50 program has been scrapped due to lack of interest.
  - \*Bill Emerson will be told that the trophy for Best of Show that he took it upon himself to present, will not be continued as it is not an AHCA trophy and it is difficult to transport and house etc
  - \*Moss Motors asked if they could donate a trophy for a long distance award at each Conclave for the winner to keep. It was approved.
  - \*Clubs with local only members that do not submit the names of these members along with the now \$10 per member for insurance by the Delegates meeting will be suspended until paid.
  - \*Clubs must submit their activity and financial reports as per the by-laws before October 1st otherwise they will be contacted by the VP of club support and if no reports forthcoming they will be suspended. This will leave the club and its officers with no insurance. These reports are needed for the insurance company as most claims are for financial mismanagement and fraud.
  - \*Edie Anderson was elected to the nominating committee. Other officers were elected as listed in Healey Margue.
  - \*A long discussion took place to decide if the dues should be increased, or the Healey Marque go digital or reduce to six copies a year or a combination of all three. It was decided to poll the membership and to pass the budget as written leaving the dues at \$50 for this coming year.
  - \*Next year the Delegate's will meet in Indianapolis at the same hotel on November 12-13th.
