## More Vintage Racing Submitted by: Peter LoRe

To align with the team livery, KIndree and Pease moved 57FAC to a black paint job, albeit without change of number or class. Number 12; Class 12P. According to Canadian racer, Craig Rodwell, 57 FAC was re-sprayed black and was eligible for a class called "improved production" (no inner wheel wells just the body skin with tire flares, a front and rear firewall, original chassis and running gear in its original position and extra wide wheels). In the UK this was known as "mod-sports". Late 66 or early 67 it was sold to John Davies and re-sprayed again back to Healey Blue with smoother wheel flares. It was sixth in the 1967 Sundown GP while I was 12th after blowing a head gasket with 15 minutes to go as we were running together most of the race. This was when I drove the car in practice to check out the clutch that had just been replaced by his and my pit crew! In the spring of 68 I was offered the car for \$1500 Canadian but couldn't come up with the cash at the time as I was getting married in September! (my loss!) I lost track of the car until 1989 at the Healey Conclave in Niagara Falls.

In the summer of 1936, Freddie March, the 9th Duke of Richmond, hosted the first hill climb at his Goodwood Estate. That event eventually grew to include the Goodwood Circuit and between 1948 and 1966, hosted some major races attracting some of the world's greatest divers - Juan Manuel Fangio, Stirling Moss, Jim Clark and Graham Hill. Unfortunately, in 1966 the track was closed due to the owner's refusal to add chicanes to limit speeds for driver's safety.

In 1993, Lord March, Freddie's grandson, decided he would bring racing back to Goodwood and started by hosting, you guessed it, a hill climb. That would grow to become the modern-day Goodwood Festival of Speed, a weekend of world class vintage car racing attended by over 100,000 visitors for each of its four-day run. The hill climb remains the centre piece for many. Those early days attracted a scant 3000 visitors, one of which was our very own Bill McNaughton.

The hill climb has changed significantly from its infancy and Bill has photos and stories from his 1994 visit, just the second year of Goodwood's rebirth.

Pour yourself your favourite beverage and join us to see how things have changed at Goodwood. Bill, a natural raconteur, guarantees an entertaining presentation and as always, bring your questions.

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## Healeys At Wings & Wheels 2023

The Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum (CWHM) is hosting its annual Wings and Wheels event on Sunday July 16, 2023. The CWHM, located in Mount Hope at the John C. Munro Hamilton International Airport, is one of the most important flying museums in the World. It owns, and flies, one of only 2 airworthy Avro Lancaster bombers in the World (the other being in the UK). It also has a flying Lysander, B-25 Mitchell, Harvard, Stearman, Dakota, Fairey Firefly, Tiger Moth, and others. The museum is a must visit if you like World War 2 heritage aircraft. Several aircraft are under restoration, including a Bristol Bolingbroke and, soon, a Mark XV Supermarine Spitfire.

Every year, the museum opens its doors to vintage cars (anything over 25 years) and allows the cars to park on the ramp in front of the main hanger. The event attracts 150-200 cars, and in fact is limited to about that number so early registration is important. The event usually runs from 9-2 and costs about \$20 (that includes your car, driver and a passenger).

One of the most rewarding parts of the event, in addition to being able to wander around the museum and view all of the static aircraft, is the opportunity to take photos of your car parked in front of one of the museum's signature aircraft - usually one of the Spitfire, B-25 Mitchell or the Lancaster.

Registration has not yet opened for the 2023 event, and I will notify members by email when registration is available. My hope is to attract a large number of Healeys from our club to the 2023 event, and I will speak to the museum about reserving an area so that we can all park together.

I am including a few photos from a past event (2018 - pre-Healey ownership for me) for your viewing pleasure. Stay tuned for notice about registration, and put this event in your calendar!
