






Handyman Corner

What is That Wrench Used For?



Wrenches and spanners are essential tools in all branches of engineering, and they take various forms, according to the purpose for which they are to be used. On this page will be found more than two dozen wrenches and spanners with their names, and the names generally indicate either the purpose for which they are intended or mark some particular make or shape. The spanner, of course, depends for its efficiency upon the principle of the lever, the power being exerted at the handle. The chain pipe wrench, as its name implies, has a steel chain at the end in place of the ordinary nose or nippers. This enables it to be fitted round pipes of any diameter, and in the drawing it is shown arranged round a pipe. Another pipe wrench is the "parrot nose." Any wrench or spanner that has a jaw sliding along it is given the general name of "monkey wrench." Several examples can be seen in the drawings above. Specimens given here are reproduced by the courtesy of Messrs. Buck & Hickman, the toolmakers of Whitechapel
